A wireless local area network (WLAN) is a wireless computer network that associates two or more devices by a wireless distribution method within a limited area (for example a home, school, computer laboratory, or office building). This gives users the ability to move around within a local coverage area and still be connected to the network, and can provide a connection to the wider Internet. Most modern WLANs are based on IEEE 802.11 standards, marketed under the Wi-Fi brand name. The basic structure of all networks consists of a main computer or server, along with connected machines known as clients. The server typically has two Ethernet network interface cards (NICs) installed and software that can support the network. In the case of a simple home wireless LAN, a desktop might be the server while a laptop could be the client. At the office, a wireless LAN provides instant connectivity to mobile personnel. It also avoids the costly expense of running Ethernet cable throughout a building, providing easy, effortless desktop connectivity between clients. Because there are no wires

running to the clients, one of the main advantages of a wireless LAN is easy installation. Wireless LANs also provide more flexibility than wired LANs and are less expensive.
