There is much debate over what grading entails and how grading should be done. As a result, research on grading is both complex and voluminous, and the topic is of central importance to composition studies. The entries are grouped in topical chapters dedicated to theoretical and practical concerns, and each citation is accompanied by an annotation that summarizes the work. Entries are arranged alphabetically by author within each section, and the volume includes author and subject indexes.

What is a rubric? A rubric is a coherent set of criteria for student work that describes levels of performance quality. Sounds simple enough, right? Unfortunately, rubrics are commonly misunderstood and misused. The good news is that when rubrics are created and used correctly, they are strong tools that support and enhance classroom instruction and student learning.
