A three-time National Book Award for Fiction winner, Saul Bellow (1915–2005) is one of the most highly regarded American authors to emerge since World War II. His 60-year career produced 14 novels and novellas, two volumes of nonfiction, short story collections, plays and a book of collected letters. His 1953 breakthrough novel *The Adventures of Augie March* was followed by *Seize the Day* (1956), *Herzog* (1964) and *Mr. Sammler's Planet* (1970). His *Humboldt's Gift* won a Pulitzer Prize in 1976 and contributed to his receiving the Nobel Prize for Literature that year.
